What was the Ten Percent Solution?




A government pardon, to confederates who swore loyalty to the Union

What was the Freedman's Bureau?




She was dedicated to improving the quality of life for African Americans. She had to teach reading, writing, and arithmetic without books or supplies to African Americans.

What is a scalawag?




This man assassinated President Lincoln at the Ford Theater


What was the name of the theatre where President Lincoln was Assassinated?


This man became the new President after Lincoln was assassinated

What were Black Codes?




The group of people that refused to ignore Black Codes

What was the 15th Amendment?




They used violence to murder and scare African Americans and their allies. The wore white hoods.
