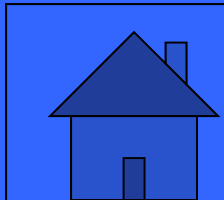
The Indians refused to give up Pikes Peak. They attacked trains, burned, and killed many soldiers and common people. The American Army retaliated in this massacre.

This was the term used to describe land that was set aside for Indians to live on by the American government

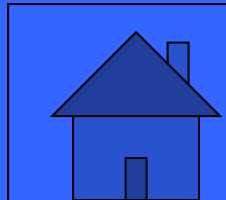

- **buffalo hunting became a fashionable sport and commercial hunters shot Buffalo to make hide blankets?**

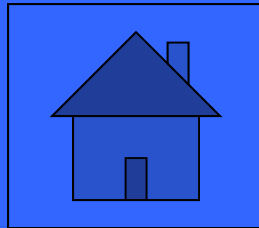

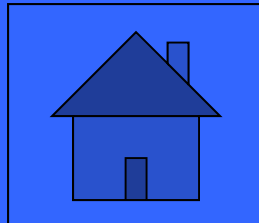
